Water, A gift to thirsty people in Kaswanga



Thanks to the sharing of your blessings, water is flowing abundantly in Kaswanga, Kenya.

In July three additional water tanks were purchased; two for the feeding center and one for the community. This provides an additional 6,200 gallons of stored water capacity at the feeding center compound.



At the feeding center there is a 10,000 liter tank that holds water being pumped from the lake. This provides water for the garden and for water purification. An additional 5,000 liter tank holds purified water and another water purifier was installed to service the feeding center.

In May, two men were hired and cross-trained in gardening and as night watchmen and water technicians. Their water technician responsibilities include, water purification, water transfer throughout the village, medical center, school and feeding center and windmill maintenance. Since taking on these responsibilities, there has been more than adequate water supplies for all of the areas being served. This was a major accomplishment.

My friends, it is in God's plan to have His disadvantaged children in Kaswanga have pure, flowing water. He has blessed those more fortunate to help make this a reality.



Living Waters Feeding Center officially opens for feeding hungry children



On July 14, Living Waters assumed the full responsibility of purchasing and preparing food for 60+ orphan children at the newly completed feeding center. Children receive one meal/day which includes protein, fresh vegetables, rice and occasionally fruit.

At first the children were anxious about coming to this new facility. They now enjoy sitting where there are no thorns and

appreciate the daily routine of forming a line. They are expressing polite appreciation for their plate of food, asking for God's blessing and giving thanks. The children are hearing a bible story every day, and are helping to wash dishes and sweep the floor after each meal.

The initial anxiety has been replaced by many smiling faces.

Living Waters Feeding Center officially opens continued

A large solar oven was purchased and shipped from Chicago, IL in January and has been installed and is operational. This is an incredible piece of equipment that can cook up to 1200 meals a day, bake 250 loafs of bread a day, sterilize medical equipment and boil water. It has a propane back up system for the infrequent cloudy day.

The center is complete with three grain silos that will hold 6 tons of grain, cooking and eating utensils, 30 feet of counter top for food preparation, two preparation and serving tables, an office, a grain room, a farm storeroom and a Living Waters store-room. The inside has been

bird, bat, and rat proofed and has windows without glass. All windows have metal security covers.

There is an open corridor which houses the large trailer -mounted solar oven at night.

The feeding area can accommodate 300+ easily.

The water purification system and storage tanks are out back by the solar oven.

The 3 acre compound has been fenced with 6 foot chain link and a lockable drive-through gate. New latrines have been built and a water catchment system collects rain water into a 10,000 liter tank.

It was overwhelming to accept the responsibility for 60+ children overnight. We were met with the reality of the amount and cost of food required to feed so many. As the children were in our presence daily, we became acutely aware of their need of basic medical care. We saw children with malaria, skin lesions, open wound infections and a host of other medical problems. We bought medications, applied first aid and prayed that God would help us care for these precious children. Many of these children only have one set of tattered clothes to wear and completely worn out shoes.

In May, a 1/2 acre plot of ground was purchased and a large garden was planted to provide fresh fruits and vege-
